On March 31, 2020, The Marin County Office of Public Health issued an order, extending the previous "shelter-in-place" order through May 3, 2020.

That order specifically lists public schools as essential services during this period of "shelter in place." Additionally, the order exempts "Public works projects if specifically designated as an Essential Governmental Function by the lead governmental agency."

The Shoreline Unified School District as the "Lead Governmental Agency" on the Construction Projects within our District can determine that Measure I projects planned for this summer are "public works construction" and serves an "Essential Governmental Function." It follows that the project would therefore fall outside the order and construction may continue.

I recommend that the Board act to designate this summer's Measure I projects as public works construction that serves an essential governmental function.

This is not a directive to proceed and construction personnel are not being required to work. Recognizing that the work taking place over the next 45-days is exterior and consistent with social distancing requirements, contractors and subcontractors are directed to observe best practices for the health and safety of their crews.
